Temporary Road and Lane Closure on the 4200, 4300, 4400, and 4700 blocks of Martin Luther King Jr, Avenue, SW, and the 100 block of Chesapeake Street, SW for DC PLUG from March 25 to April 5, 2024.

(WASHINGTON, DC) – The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is advising of temporary road closures on the following streets from 4200, 4300, 4400, and 4700 Martin Luther King Jr, Avenue, SW between Chesapeake Street, SW, and Joliet Street, SW, and 100 block of Chesapeake Street, between 2nd Street, SW, and Martin Luther King, Jr Avenue, SW for PCC base and final restoration of milling and paving,

The temporary road closure will begin from March 27 to April 5, 2024, between 7 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday weather permitting. Residents will still have access to their apartments, and parking will be prohibited as marked by "Emergency No Parking" signs.

The road closure is necessary to complete the DC Power Line Undergrounding (DC PLUG) initiative's Feeder 14758 project for the final restoration of milling and paving. The DC PLUG initiative is a partnership between the DDOT and Pepco to improve the resiliency and reliability of the District of Columbia electric system by placing select systems underground. Feeders are primary distribution power lines that provide services to approximately 1,100 residents within a specific neighborhood.
