Temporary Road Closure and Detour from the 200, 400, and 500 Blocks of Newcomb Street, SE, and the 2900 block of 4th Street, SE For DC PLUG Feeder 15166 Begins July 22-26, 2024.

(WASHINGTON, DC) – The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) advises stakeholders to expect delays due to the upcoming road closure and detour for the final restoration of Milling and Paving on the **200, 400, and 500 blocks of Newcomb Street, SE, and the 2900 block of 4th Street, SE**. All residents will keep access to their homes. Please adhere to all NO Parking signs.

- **1a. Newcomb St. SE between 2nd St and Newcomb St. SE traffic detour on 4th Street and right onto Oakwood and another right on 2nd Street, SE**
- **1b. 4th Street, SE between Mellon St. and Orange St. SE---- traffic detour left turn on Mellon and then right on 5th and then a right on Orange Street, SE**
- **1c. Newcomb St. SE between 4th Street. and Newcomb St. SE--- traffic detour on 4th Street and right onto Oakwood and another right on 2nd Street, SE**
- **2. Newcomb St. SE between 4th St. and Malcolm X Ave. SE--- Traffic detour keep straight on Malcolm X and make a right turn on Oakwood and right on 4th Street**

The road closure is estimated to last 1 week for the final restoration (weather permitting). The restoration is necessary to complete the DC PLUG initiative's Feeder 15166 project which consists of undergrounding powerlines for a more resilient DC.
