**(WASHINGTON, DC)** – The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is advising stakeholders to expect Road Closure due to manhole enclosure and precast base weather permitting. Parking will be restricted. However, residents will still have access to their homes. Please adhere to all No Parking signs. .

The road closure is necessary to complete the DC PLUG initiative’s Feeder 15009 project manhole enclosure and precast base installation. The DC PLUG Initiative consists of undergrounding powerlines for a more resilient DC.
