Temporary Road Closure on the 2300 block of 13th Place, NE, 2200 block of 13th Street, NE and 2300 Downing Street, NE and 1300 block of Downing Place, NE For DC PLUG Feeder 14008 from August 19-23, 2024.

(WASHINGTON, DC) – The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is advising of a temporary road closure on the **2300 block of 13th Place, NE, 13th Street, NE, and 2300 block of Street, NE and 1300 block of Downing Place, NE** for milling and paving restoration.

- **2300 block of 13th Place, NE between Bryant Street and Downing Street, NE**
- **2200 block of 13th Street, NE between Bryant Street and Downing Street, NE**
- **2300 block of Downing Street, NE between Bryant Street, NE and 13th, Street, NE**
- **1300 block of Downing Place, NE between Adams Street and 14th Street, NE**

The temporary road closure will begin on August 19-23, 2024, between 7:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., weather permitting. Residents will still have access to their homes, and parking will be prohibited as marked by “Emergency No Parking” signs.

The road closure is necessary to complete the DC Power Line Undergrounding (DC PLUG) initiative’s Feeder 14008 for conduit installation. The DC PLUG initiative is a partnership between the DDOT and Pepco to improve the resiliency and reliability of the District of Columbia electric system by placing select systems underground. Feeders are primary distribution power lines that provide services to approximately 1,100 residents within a specific neighborhood.
