Road Closure

On 8th Street, NW, between Rittenhouse Street, NW and Roxboro Street, NW.

Beginning August 30th, 2023, from 10:00am to 1:00pm.

(WASHINGTON, DC) – The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) is advising stakeholders to expect Road Closure due to continued work on two manhole installations weather permitting. Parking will be restricted. Please adhere to all No Parking signs.

- **Beginning August 30th, 2023 on 8th Street, NW, between Rittenhouse Street, NW and Roxboro Street, NW from 10:00am to 1:00pm, Road Closure.**

The road closure is necessary to complete the DC PLUG initiative's Feeder 15009 project manhole installation. The DC PLUG Initiative consists of undergrounding powerlines for a more resilient DC.
